Lower Intermediate 2 CEFR A2.2	15 weeks	4 12 – 14	This course concludes the basic level of German teaching. It is particularly suitable as a refresher course to students who have previously studied German to a high level (e.g. A-level) but have not used it in a long time. This course prepares students to take part in the Intermediate level courses.

Intermediate CEFR B1.1	2x15 weeks	5 1-7	At Intermediate level you will build on all the basics you have learnt so far. Your vocabulary will become wider and your style more sophisticated to adjust to a variety of different situations and settings. These topics are covered in this course: Reading and discussing newspaper articles Talking about childhood memories Finding consensus in a group discussion Expressing opinions and preferences Polite language in disagreement and conflict

Advanced CEFR B1.2	2x15 weeks	6 8 - 14	This course concludes B1 level of the European Framework of Reference and is regarded as the minimum level for qualified employment on the German job market. Separate exam preparation for B1 level can be arranged in private tuition at the end of this course. These topics are covered: Office Talk and team meetings Understanding technical instructions and manuals Planning and agreeing on processes Retelling misfortunes and complaining about unsatisfying goods/services Understanding and giving advice History and Politics



Proficient CEFR B2/C1	This high-level German class will be tailored to the interests of the participants. We will spend a lot of time

GCSE Prep Proficiency Spring 2022 Thurs 4-5pm	One academic year Enrolment one half- term at a time	AQA	We will concentrate on exam preparation, with a heavy emphasis on the writing element. We will work through numerous exam-style questions. The language learning, vocabulary and syntax, will all be geared towards supporting the exam requirements.
GCSE Prep Foundation Spring 2022/2023 Thurs 6.30 - 7.30pm	One academic year Enrolment one half- term at a time	AQA	We will prepare the GCSE exam by broadening the vocabulary range and syntax of learners. We will work predominantly on the Writing and Speaking elements, ensuring that the learners grow in confidence and competence. The topics will be taken from the GCSE curriculum.
